- Every country in the world become richer, but inequality & inequity getting bigger.
- Ill-health & health care cost maintain the circle of poverty & slow down the progress of other SDGs.
- Dr. Takao Toda of JICA: "Japan adopted UHC policy because we were poor".



- 1. Reaffirm the right of every human being, without distinction of any kind, to the enjoyment of the highest attainable standard of physical and mental health;
- Reaffirm General Assembly resolution 70/1 of 25 September 2015, entitled "Transforming our world: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development", stressing the need for a comprehensive and people-centred approach, with a view to leaving no one behind, reaching the furthest behind first, and the importance of health



UHC, PHC, pandemic

- New terminology "Covid migrants".
 Millions & millions of people ran away: China, India, Vietnam...
- Health system overwhelmed;
- Primary health care was not mobilized as the first line of response;
- UHC has not covered prevention & unconventional health needs.
- Consequences are huge in all aspects.



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Common target: "the furthest behind"

- Climate change is due to human activities the poorest are the most affected;
- Zoonotic diseases such as Covid-19 transmitted to human due to human behaviors – the poorest are the most affected;
- The poor has little to none resilience to ill-health or cost of health care;
- → VULNERABILITY

It all starts with people, ends with people

- People know what works best for them;
- People can be mobilized & organized to respond;
- Civil society are best placed to reach and facilitate the participation of the furthest behind.
